

**You will need:**

- Paper plate, cardstock or cereal box
- Scissors
- Glue
- Markers or paint
- Yarn, string, or elastic



**Directions:**

1. Print and cut the template out. Trace the mask portion onto a paper plate, cardstock or a cereal box and cut out.



2. Fold a paper plate, a piece of cardstock, or piece of cereal box in half and trace the beak template out.

**Note:** Make sure to line the top of the template along the fold of your paper.



3. Cut out the beak. It should look like the picture when you are done.



4. Make a 1/4" cut on the flat edge of the fold (see pic) and fold up the edges.



5. Fold the beak in half with the folded edges sticking out and glue the top (side with the fold) edges together.



6. Glue the folded edges, on the beak, to the back of the mask.



7. When you flip you mask over, it should look like this!



8. Color your mask using paint or markers. Horned puffins have orange triangles around their eyes, an orange and yellow bill, black horns above their eyes, black streaks off the sides of their eyes, and don't forget their orange rictal rosettes (orange circles) at the base of their bill!



9. Tie yarn, string or elastic in the small holes on the sides of the mask. Put on your mask and channel your inner puffin!!! :)
